Since its inception, the EU has been a resounding success story. The European unity project has created an enduring foundation for prosperity and above all, democratic peace. However, for the past decade, Europe has faced significant challenges to its geopolitical, social and economic foundations. This has led analysts and policy-makers to argue that Europe is indeed ‘at a cross-roads’, prompting questions about Europe’s future trajectory and its capacity to continue to act coherently, autonomously and in accordance with its founding principles. The European Commission President-Elect Ursula von der Leyen recently signaled the vision of “a stronger Europe in the World”. This lecture will reflect on where Europe is headed and how it is placed to deliver on this vision.
